- 10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>16</sub>" x 16<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" piece 14-count jonquil yellow Aida or 28-count ivory linen from Wichelt Imports, Inc.\*
  - One skein each DMC® or Anchor® six-strand embroidery floss\*\*
  - One card Rainbow Gallery Fuzzy Stuff™\*\*
  - One skein DMC® Coton Perle #3\*\*
  - Size 24 tapestry needle
  - Professionally framed\*

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**Stitch count:** 6311 x 143W

**Design size:** 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

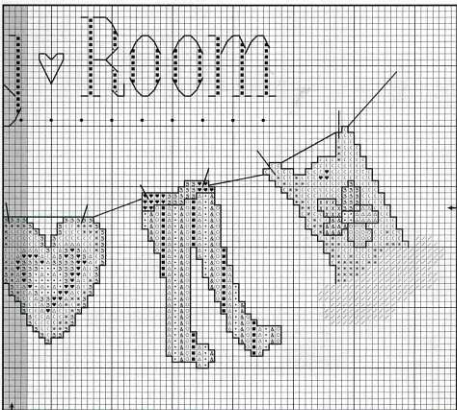
**Instructions:** Cross stitch over one square on Aida or over two threads on linen, using two strands of floss or one strand of Fuzzy Stuff. When two colors are bracketed together, use one strand of each.

Backstitch over one square on Aida or over two threads on linen, using two strands of floss unless otherwise indicated.

Work French knot where ● appears, using three strands 166/279 and wrapping floss around needle once.

Work long stitch for ruffle, using one strand of coton perlé.

Work straight stitch for clothespins.



using two strands 435/365. Work straight stitch for ends of bow on purple dress, using two strands 349/13.

Work lazy-daisy stitch for loops of bow on purple dress, using two strands 349/13.

#### Backstitch (bs) instructions:

349	13	small heart between words
166	279	large heart in center
3031	905	clothing outlines (one strand)

## TASSEL-MAKING HOW-TO'S

### Materials:

One skein of floss (**NOTE:** Refer to color code for specific color and fiber used.)

Square piece sturdy cardboard, approximately 1" larger than desired finished size of tassel

Hand-sewing needle

Scissors

1. Cut two 6" lengths of floss from full skein, to be used for tying top of tassel.
2. Wrap remaining floss around cardboard, referring to Illustration 1 and being careful not to bend cardboard by wrapping floss too tightly.
3. Slip one 6" length of floss under wrapped floss at top edge of cardboard and tie securely, referring to Illustration 2. Do not trim floss tails.
4. Carefully remove cardboard.
5. Referring to Illustration 3, wind second

6" length of floss around neck of tassel,  $\frac{1}{4}$ "- $\frac{1}{2}$ " from top of tassel. Thread needle with floss tail and wrap around tie several times, referring to Illustration 4. Bury floss end in tassel. Repeat for remaining floss tail.

6. Cut along bottom of tassel through all fibers. Trim bottom of tassel to desired length and so that floss is even.

7. Attach tassel, using floss tail at top of tassel to secure.
